Dear Valued Customer,

Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010 requires manufacturers that file with the SEC to determine if their products contain "conflict minerals" (Tantalum (Ta), Tungsten (W), Tin (Sn), and Gold (Au)). If so, the manufacturer must investigate the source of the minerals and report whether the minerals may have originated in the Democratic Republic of Congo or surrounding countries.

As a supplier to public manufacturers and the U.S Government, Dynamic Balance Machine supports the initiative set forth with this law and is committed to helping its customers achieve compliance within the requested time frame.

Dynamic Balance Machine's efforts related to conflict minerals are aligned to the work of the Electronic Industry Citizenship Coalition® (EICC®) and Global eSustainability Initiative (GeSI). The EICC's and GeSI's work includes the Conflict-Free Smelter Program and the Conflict Minerals Reporting Template ("Template").

In accordance with company policy, Dynamic Balance Machine maintains a Conflict Minerals Declaration available at all times and posted on our website. The declaration scope is company level, and therefore encompasses the entirety of Dynamic Balance Machine products.

Updates to this declaration are performed annually, polling our suppliers annually, using the most recent revision of the EICC Conflict Minerals Reporting Template at that time, and released once all responses are received.
